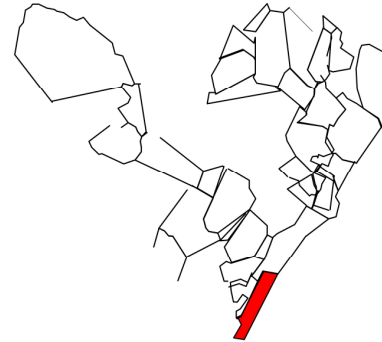


# Betsy Lewis – 270 acres in Greenbrier County

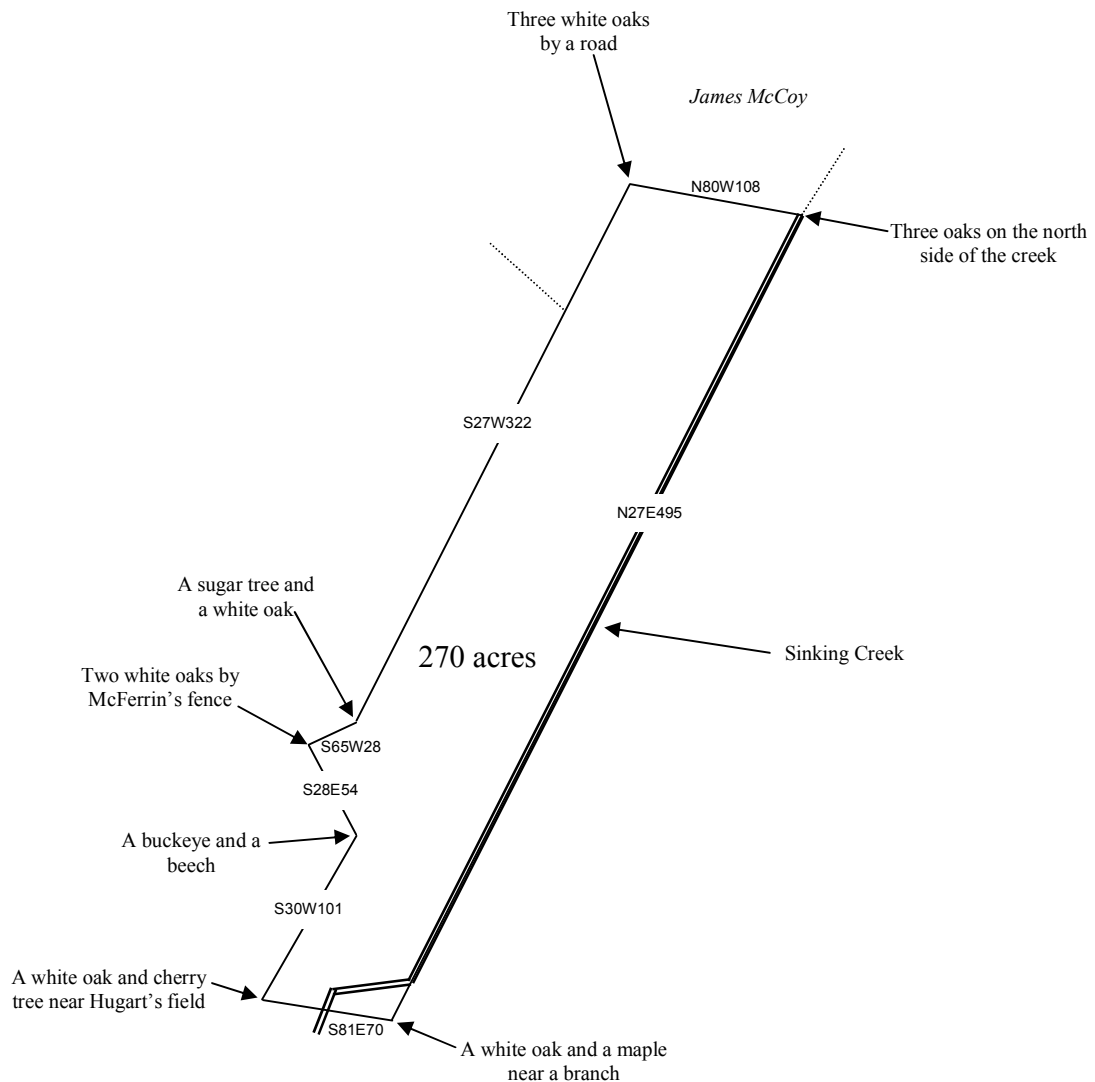
## History

December 24, 1782	Warrant 15047 issued
May 6, 1797	Date of Survey
July 3, 1800	Patented by James Monroe, Esq., Governor of Virginia
March 30, 1801	Examined; grant delivered to Maje. John Brown



## Description

270 acres in Greenbrier County on Sinking Creek and joining the lands of James McCoy, William Hugart, and John Wooden known by the name of Murphey's place



ridge North forty eight degrees West fifty five poles to a white oak, on a hill side, corner to Blake and with his Survey of fifty one acres, South eighty six degrees East eighty poles to two dogwoods on the top of the hill North fifty eight degrees East forty one poles to a chestnut on a point, North thirty three degrees East one hundred and thirty eight poles to a maple white oak and chestnut oak, corner to Mushbarger's Survey of thirty three acres, and with the same South thirty degrees East one hundred and thirty four poles, to two white oaks on a branch corner on Mushbarger's open line of his old Survey, and runs with the same South seven degrees West two hundred and thirty five poles to the beginning with its appurtenances to have, and to hold the said tracter parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said William Drogg and his heirs forever, In Witness whereof the said James Monroe Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond, on the second day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and of the Commonwealth the twenty fourth

James Monroe Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia to all to whom these presents shall come Greeting Know Ye, That by virtue of part of a Land office Treasury warrant number fifteen thousand and forty seven issued the twenty fourth of December one thousand seven hundred and eighty two, There is Granted by the said Commonwealth unto Deleg Lewis a Certain tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and seventy acres, by Survey bearing date the sixth day of May one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven, lying and being in the County of Greenbrier, on Sinkin Creek, and joining the land of James McCoy, William Hougart and John Wooden known by the name of Murphreys place and bounded as followeth to wit beginning at three white oaks on the North side of the Creek, corner to McCoy and with his line, North eighty degrees West one hundred and eight poles

to three white oaks, by a road, South twenty seven degrees West three  
hundred and twenty two poles to a sugar tree, and a white oak South  
sixty five degrees West twenty eight, poles to two white oaks, by  
W. Ferris fence, South twenty eight degrees East fifty four poles to a  
buckeye and beech, South thirty degrees West one hundred and one poles  
to a white oak and cherry tree, near Burgarts field, South eighty one  
degrees East seventy poles crossing the creek, at thirty two poles to a  
white oak and maple, near a branch, and thence North twenty seven  
degrees East four hundred and ninety five poles crossing the creek,  
several times, to three white oaks the beginning with its appurtenances  
To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances  
to the said Botey Lewis and his heirs forever, In Witness whereof the said  
James Monroe Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath  
hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser seal of the said Commonwealth  
to be affixed at Richmond, on the Third day of July, in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and of the Commonwealth the twenty  
fourth.

and fifty acres, by number Seventeen thousand six hundred and thirty  
six, issued the fifth of July one thousand seven hundred and eighty  
three, and eighty acres by number one thousand four hundred and  
twenty three, issued the tenth day of June one thousand seven hun-  
dred and ninety five There is granted by the said Commonwealth  
unto, Samuel Sams. Certain tract or parcel of land containing <sup>two hundred</sup> and  
thirty acres, by Survey bearing date the Seventeenth day of February  
one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight, lying and being in  
the County of Greenbrier, on the waters of the Plank Cabbins draft, a  
branch of Second Creek, where he now lives joining the lands of Robert  
Reed, James Flemming, James Sarkin, and John Reed, and is
