


## History

## **Description**

2085 acres in Greenbrier County on the waters of Little Clear Creek and Laurel Run including the forks of said Creek and Run and along Buffalo Lick and joining the land of Henry Banks and William Jordon; 1820 deed described it as the Laurel Run and Buckeye Garden on Little Clear Creek.
