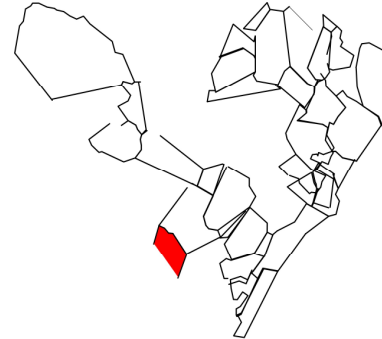


## JAMES JORDON SENR. – 220 ACRES IN GREENBRIER COUNTY

### *History*

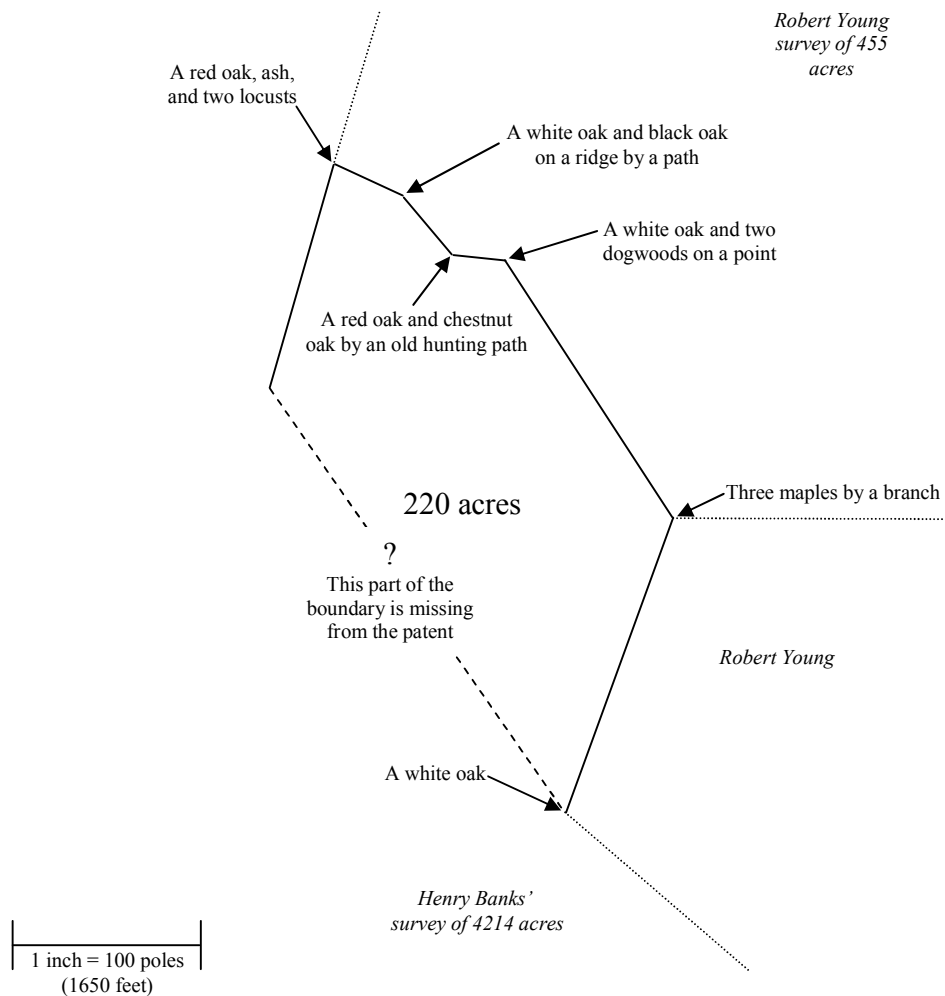
August 26, 1782	Warrant number 13971 issued

### *Description*

220 acres in Greenbrier County on the waters of Hugarts Creek adjoining the lands of Henry Banks and Robert Young

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Forty degrees East one hundred and twenty poles to a hessnut  
and dogwood on a hill side South thirty five degrees East,  
Two hundred and eighty poles to two white oaks near the  
Top of a ridge and thence South fifty nine degrees West  
Two hundred and five poles to the Beginning, with its  
appurtenances To have and to hold the said Tract or  
Parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said Samuel  
Kincaid and his heirs for ever. In witness whereof the  
said James Monroe esquire Governor of the Commonwealth  
of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the  
Great Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at  
Richmond on the Eighth day of October, in the Year of  
our Lord One thousand eight Hundred and of the Com-  
monwealth the Twentyfifth.

ye that by virtue of a Land Office Treasury Warrant Number  
Thirteen Thousand Nine hundred and Seventy one issued the  
Twenty sixth of August One thousand Seven hundred and  
eighty two There is granted by the said Commonwealth  
unto James Gordon Senior, a certain Tract or parcel of land  
containing Two hundred and Twenty Acres, by survey bearing  
date the twenty second day of November, One thousand Seven  
Hundred and Ninety four, lying and being in the County of  
Greenbrier on the Waters of Hugart, Creek adjoining the  
lands of Henry Banks and Robert Young and bounded as  
followeth to wit: Beginning at a white oak corner to Banks  
Survey of Four thousand Two hundred and fourteen <sup>acres</sup> and with  
a line of said Survey, North twenty degrees East One hundred  
and sixty eight poles to three Maples by a branch corner to  
two surveys of Youngs, and with his Survey of Four hundred

and Fifty five Acres. North thirty three degrees West One hundred and sixty four poles to a white oak and two Dogwoods on a point North eighty four degrees West Twenty eight poles to a red oak and Chesnut oak by an old hunting path North forty degrees West Forty poles to a white oak and black oak on a Ridge by a path North Sixty five degrees West forty poles to a red oak, ash and two locusts and leaving Youngs line South sixteen degrees West One hundred and twenty four poles to the Beginning with the appurtenances To have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances To the said James Gordon Senior and his heirs for ever. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the Tenth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight Hundred and of the Commonwealth the Twenty fifth.
