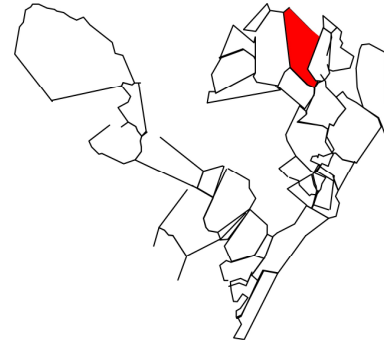


Robert Young – 425 acres in Greenbrier County

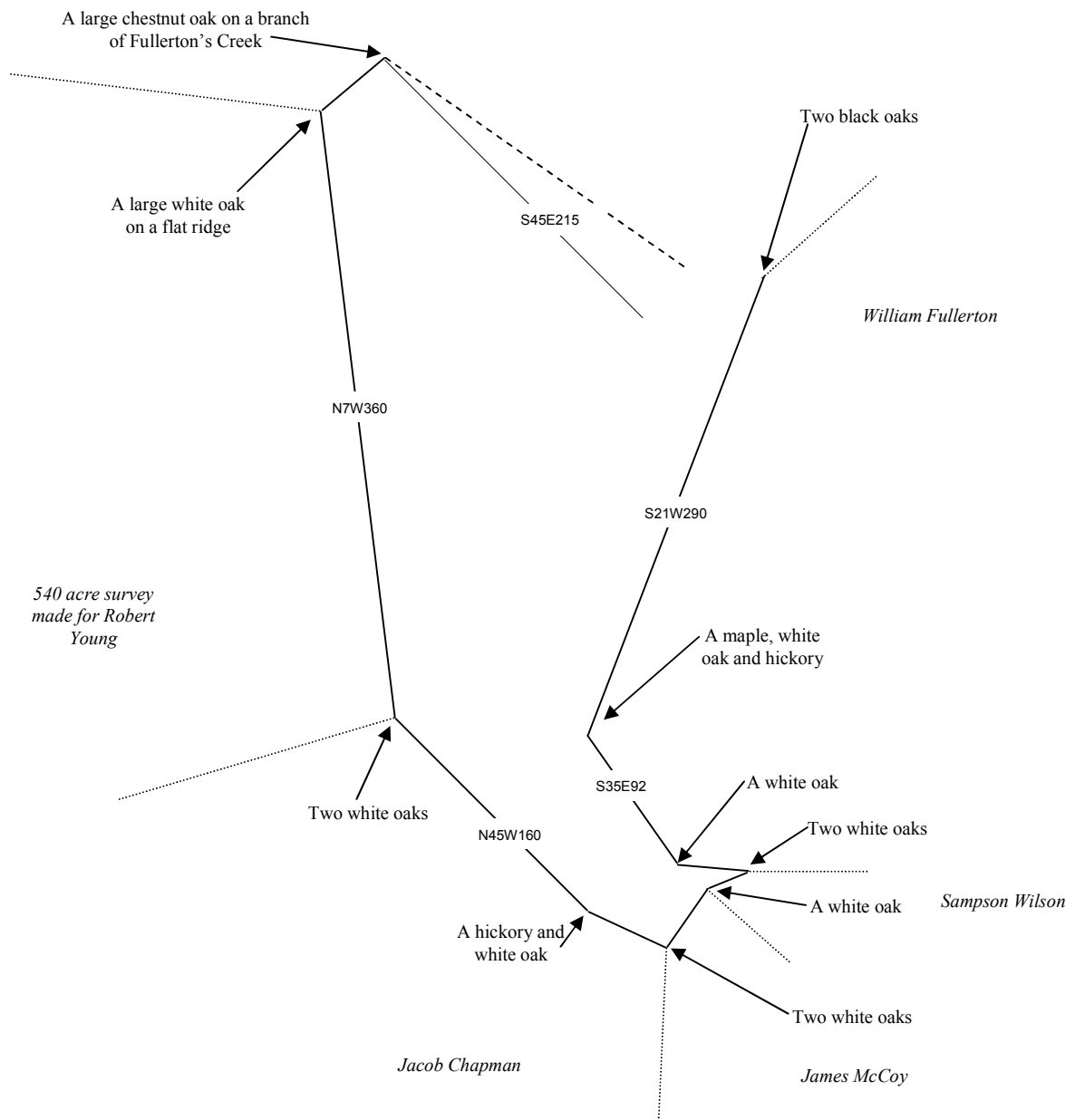

Description

425 acres in Greenbrier County on waters of Sinking Creek joining the lands of William Fullerton, Sampson Wilson, James McCoy and Jacob Chapman



Young and his Heirs forever In Witness whereof the said Robert Brooke Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his Hand and caused the lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be Affixed at Richmond on the nineteenth day of February in the Year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six and of the Commonwealth the twentieth

Robert Brooke Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia To all To Whom these presents shall come Greeting Knowye that by virtue of Land Office Treasury Warrants Number twelve thousand two hundred and twenty seven, and fourteen thousand, there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Robert Young a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing four hundred and twenty five Acres by Survey bearing date the twenty ninth day of November one thousand seven hundred and ninety three, lying and being in the County of Greenbrier on waters of Sinking Creek joining the Land of William Fullerton Sampson Wilson, James McCoy and Jacob Chapman and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at two black oaks corner to Fullerton, and running with his open line, South twenty one degrees West two hundred and ninety poles to a white oak and hickory his beginning corner, and with South thirty five degrees East ninety two poles to a white oak, and South eighty five degrees East forty two poles to two white oaks corner the same on Sampson Wilsons line and with Wilson South sixty eight degrees West twenty four poles to a white oak corner to the same and McCoy, and with South thirty five degrees West forty two poles to two white oaks corner the same and Chapmans and with Chapmans, North sixty five degrees West fifty poles to a hickory and white oak North forty five degrees West one hundred and sixty poles to two white oaks corner to Chapman, and corner to a Survey of five hundred and forty Acres made for said Young, and with Youngs Survey North seven degrees West three hundred and sixty poles to a large white oak, on a flat ridge corner to the same, and leaving said Survey North fifty degrees East forty eight poles to a large Chestnut oak on a Branch of Fullertons Creek thence South forty five degrees East two hundred and fifteen poles to the two black oaks Fullertons corner the beginning With

that by virtue of a Land Office Treasury Warrant Number nine thousand
nine hundred and twenty three issued the fifteenth of December one thou
sand seven hundred and eighty one there is Granted by the said Common
wealth unto James Givens Assignee of Samuel Peoples a certain Tract
or Parcel of Land containing two hundred and eighteen Acres by Survey
bearing date the twenty seventh day of September one thousand seven
hundred and ninety one, lying and being in the County of Kenhaws
on the first Creek that supplies into Elk River, on the South East side,
above the mouth of Elk River and is bounded as followeth to wit Begin
ning about a quarter of a mile up said Creek from the River at two
Poplars, on the East side of ^{the} Creek, and running thence North twenty
six degrees East one hundred and forty two poles crossing the Creek to a
white oak and dogwood on a ridge thence South sixty four degrees East
two hundred and two poles to two poplars and a dogwood, thence South
twenty six degrees West two hundred and five poles crossing the Creek
to three white oaks on the bank thereof, thence North forty six degrees
West two hundred and eleven poles to the beginning With its Appurte
nances to have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of Land With its
Appurtenances to the said James Givens and his Heirs forever In
Witness whereof the said Robert Brooke Esquire Governor of the
Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his Hand and caused
