

# William Donaldson – 200 acres in Greenbrier County

## History

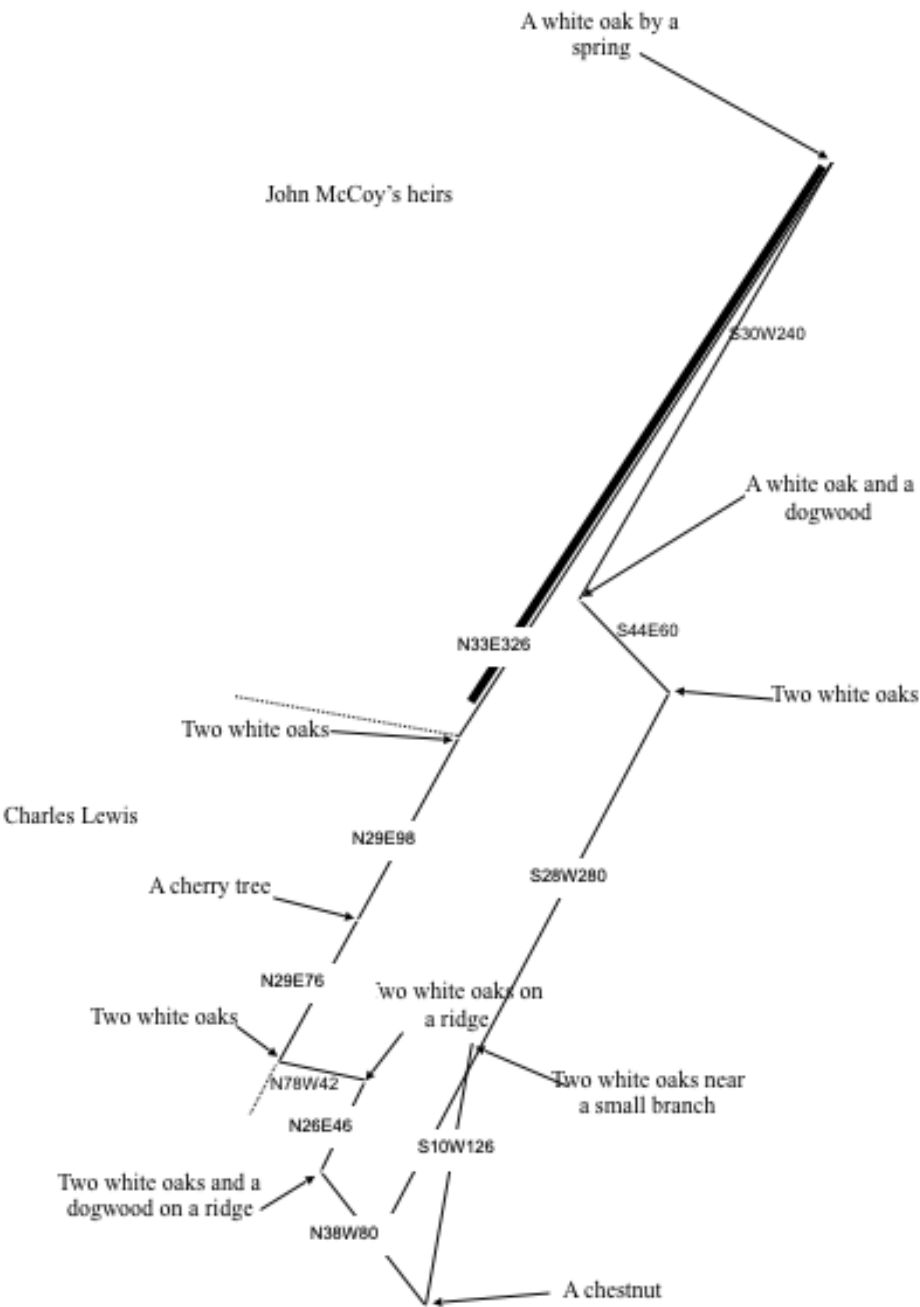
July 1, 1791	138 acres granted to Andrew Donnally Junr.
April 26, 1796	Donnally and his wife conveyed the same (138 acres) to William Donaldson by deed of bargain and sale
December 10, 1804	Exchanged warrant number 1696 issued, covering 12 acres
December 10, 1804	Exchanged warrant number 1698 issued, covering 50 acres
November 12, 1807	Date of Survey
September 1, 1809	Patent signed by John Tyler, Esq., Governor of Virginia
May 16, 1817	Examined and delivered to Mr. Samuel McClung bearer on order

## Description

200 acres in Greenbrier County on Little Sinking Creek joining the lands of John McCay’s heirs [John McCoy’s heirs], Charles Lewis, deceased, and Andrew Hamilton.

## Boundary

Beginning at	two white oaks near a small branch thence
S10W126	to a ?biozed chestnut
N38W80	to two white oaks and a dogwood on a ridge
N26E46	to two white oaks on a ridge
N78W42	to two white oaks in Lewis’ line and with his line
N29E76	to a cherry tree thence continuing the same course
98 poles	to two white oaks corner to McCoy thence with McCoy’s line
N33E326	crossing the creek five times to a white oak by a spring
S30W240	to a white oak and dogwood
S44E60	to two white oaks and thence
S28W280	to the beginning

thence south ten degrees, West one hundred and twenty six poles to a

blazed chestnut north thirty eight degrees, West eighty poles to two

white oaks and a dogwood on a ridge north twenty six east forty

one poles to two white oaks on a ridge north seventy eight degrees

West forty two poles to two white oaks in Lewis's line and with his

line north twenty nine degrees east seventy six poles to a Cherry tree

thence continuing the same course ninety eight poles to two white oaks

corner to McBoys, thence with McBoys line north thirty three degrees

east three hundred and seventy six poles crossing the creek five

times to a white oak by a Spring, South thirty degrees West two

hundred and forty poles to a white oak and dogwood South

forty four degrees East sixty poles to two white oaks and thence South  
twenty eight degrees West two hundred and eighty poles to the  
beginning with its appurtenances; To have and to hold  
the said tract or parcels of Land with its appurtenances to the  
said William Donaldson and his heirs for ever. In witness  
whereof the said John Tyler esquire, Governor of the Commonwealth  
of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser seal  
of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the first  
day of September in the year of our lord one thousand eight  
hundred and nine and of the Commonwealth the thirty fourth.

shall come Greeting: Know ye that by virtue of a Land  
office Certificate the said Alexander two thousand six hundred and  
twenty two Sheds the first day of January Seventeen hundred  
one money and there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto  
James O. Campbell a piece of George Sheets a certain tract or  
parcel of Land containing one hundred acres by Survey bearing date  
the fifteenth day of April one thousand seven hundred and ninety  
nine lying and being in the county of Punditow, on some east  
branches of Bull pastured, river adjoining the lands of John Yager  
and John Wood and bounded as followeth to wit: Beginning at a  
red oak and chestnut, thence north thirty one degrees East sixty one poles  
to a large red oak, north fifty three degrees East twenty poles to a red  
oak on a steep Hill side, north forty two degrees, East sixty poles to a  
Sugar tree in a draft north thirteen degrees West one hundred and  
eighty poles to a white oak and maple, South twenty one degrees  
West two hundred and seventy eight poles crossing several Branch  
and ridges to four white oaks and thence South sixty one degrees East sixty  
poles to the beginning with its appurtenances; To have and  
to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances
