Description

138 acres in Greenbrier County on Sinking Creek joining the land of John Finton, Charles Lewis, deceased, and John McCoy’s heirs

Boundary

Beginning at	a white oak by a small branch and running thence
N44W90	-- Finton’s corner at 50 poles and running crossing the creek to a cherry tree corner to Lewis and with his line
N29E98	to two white oaks corner to McCoy and with the same
N36E174	crossing the creek three times to a white oak and dogwood and thence leaving said line
S44E60	to a white oak and chestnut on a hillside and
S28W280	to the beginning



degrees West thirty seven poles to two white oaks, thence South fifty
degrees West ninety poles to a Walnut, thence South twelve degrees
West seventy nine poles to two white oaks on a ridge, thence South
fifty eight degrees East three hundred and twenty poles to the Begin-
ning, with its Appurtenances to have and to hold the said Tract or
Parcel of Land with its Appurtenances to the said John Melf and
his Heirs for ever. In Witness whereof the said Beverly Ran-

here unto set his hand and caused the lesser Seal of the said Com-
monwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the Thirtieth day of June,

hundred eighty Six, Lying and being in the County of Greenbrier,
on Sinking Creek Joining the land of John Sinton, Charles
Lewis dead and John McCoy's Heirs and bounded as followeth
(To wit) Beginning at a white oak by a small branch and running
thence North forty four degrees West ninety poles striking Sinton's
Corner at fifty Poles and running Crossing that creek to a cherry

tree corner to Lewis and with his line North twenty nine degrees East
 ninety eight poles to two white oaks corner to Mr. Coy and with the same
 North thirty six degrees East one hundred and seventy four poles crossing
 the Creek three times to a white oak and Dogwood and thence leaving said
 line South forty four degrees East sixty poles to a white oak and ~~thence~~
 on a hill side and South twenty eight degrees West two hundred and
