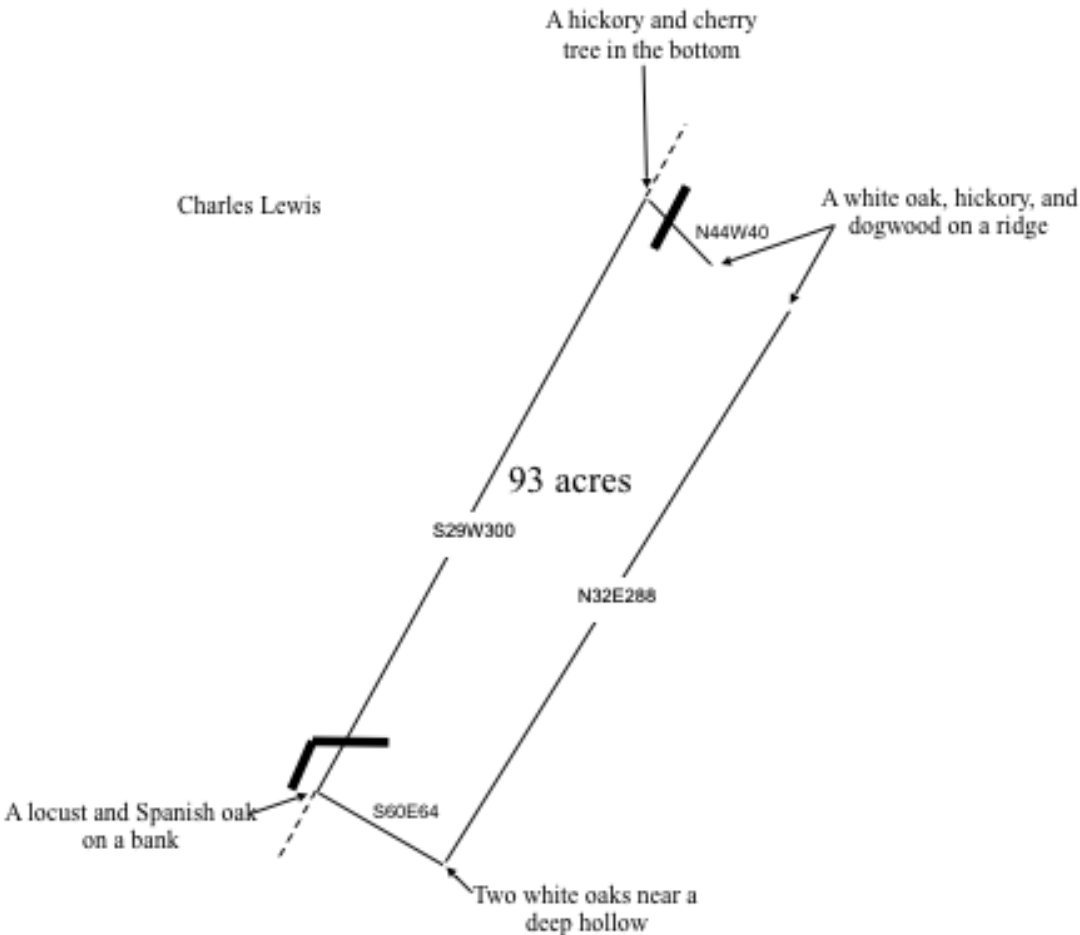

93 acres in Greenbrier County on Sinking Creek adjoining the land of Charles Lewis, deceased

Boundary

Beginning at	a white oak, hickory and dogwood on a ridge on the east side of the creek thence
N44W40	crossing the creek to a hickory and cherry tree in the bottom on Lewis' line and with the same
S29W300	crossing the creek several times to a locust and Spanish oak on a bank the east side of the creek thence leaving Lewis' line
S60E64	to two white oaks near a deep hollow thence
N32E288	to the beginning



degrees West sixty poles to a poplar thence North seventy degrees East five hundred  
seventy poles to the beginning with its appurtenances to have and to hold the  
tract or parcel of Land, with its appurtenances to the said William Roben-  
son and his heirs forever In witness whereof the said Bever-

Danielson a certain tract or parcel of Land containing ninety three Acres by Survey  
bearing Date the twenty eighth day of August one thousand seven hundred  
eighty, Lying and being in the County of Greenbrier on Licking Creek adjoining  
the Land of Charles Lewis deceased and bounded as followeth To wit Beginning  
at a white oak, hickory and dogwood on a ridge on the East side of the Creek thence  
North forty four degrees West forty poles crossing the Creek to a Hickory & Cherry tree  
in the bottom on Lewis's line and with the same South twenty nine degrees  
West three hundred poles crossing the Creek several times to a Locust & Spanish

 sixty Degrees East sixty four poles to two white oaks near a deep hollow
