

352 acres in Greenbrier County on Sinking Creek joining the lands of Charles Lewis, deceased, Joseph McClung, John Williams, and the heirs of James Burns

twenty six poles down said hill to two white oaks on Waggoners line South thirty
three degrees West one hundred and twenty poles with Waggoners line to a red
Oak corner of the same, and thence South twenty five degrees West one hundred
and sixty poles with said Waggoners line to the beginning, with its appurtenances

the lands of Charles Lewis deceased Joseph McElung John Williams
and the heirs of James Burns, and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning
at two black oaks corner to Burns and with his line, South sixty seven degrees West
eighty six poles to a red oak South twenty one degrees West forty poles to a black
Oak

Oak and white Oak, south fifty degrees East fourteen poles to white Oak and black Oak south
 two degrees West twenty two poles to white Oak on Lewis line and with South twenty degrees
 West fifty nine poles to two white Oaks on Richard Williams line and with the same
 eight degrees West fifty four poles to white Oak on Joseph McChung line and leaving
 South four degrees West ninety seven poles to white Oak South seventeen degrees East one
 hundred and forty eight poles to white Oak South thirty degrees West one hundred poles to
 white Oak and hickory South forty four degrees East ninety six poles to yellow Lynn South
 twenty three degrees East three hundred and seventy poles to the beginning, with its
 appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with its appur-
 tenances to the said George Mollham and his heirs forever In Witnes whereof the

 Office Treasury Warrants Numbers thirteen thousand and ninety one, and thirteen
 thousand seven hundred and fifty five, there is Granted by the said Common-
 wealth unto Joshua Snodgrass, ^{Assignee of Eli Perkins} a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing
 one hundred and thirty Acres by survey bearing date the Seventeenth day of
 December one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, lying and being in
 the County of Greenbrier, on the south side of Greenbrier River and Anthony
 Creek, and bounded as followeth to Wit Beginning at a forked Chestnut and
 black Oak, thence west fifty poles to white Oak and dogwood south twenty six
 degrees West forty poles to a black Oak and white Oak on the point of a ridge
 south fifty five degrees East twenty six poles to a black Oak and two poplars
 South sixty degrees East ninety two poles to three forked Chestnuts south
 eighty five degrees East twenty eight poles to two white Oaks South eighty eight
 degrees East seventy poles crossing a branch of Anthony Creek to three poplars
 south seventy degrees East fifty eight poles to a black Oak and
