Description

300 acres in Greenbrier County joining the land of Charles Lewis, deceased, and William McCoy on Sinking Creek

Boundary

Beginning at	a white oak and hickory corner to Lewis and running with
N22W270	to two black oaks and a white oak and leaving
North 40 poles	to three white oaks corner to McCoy and with his line
S35W280	to three white oaks by a savannah and leaving
S20E140	to two white oaks in the head of a hollow, and
N68E222	to the beginning

that by virtue of Land Office Treasury Warrant Number
fifteen thousand and ten Given the twenty first day of December
one thousand seven hundred and eighty two, There is granted
by the said Commonwealth unto John Ryburn Esquire of
Robert Young, a certain tract or parcel of Land containing three
hundred Acres by Survey bearing date the eighth day of
February one thousand seven hundred and ninety, lying and
being in the County of Greenbrier joining the Land of Charles
Lewis Deceased and William M^r Bay on Sinkin Creek
and bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning at a white oak
and hickory corner to Lewis, & running with North twenty
two degrees West two hundred and seventy poles to two black oaks
and a white oak, and leaving North forty poles to three white
oaks corner to M^r Bay, and with his line South thirty five
degrees West two hundred and eighty poles to three white oaks
by a Savannah, and leaving South twenty degrees East one
hundred and forty poles to two white oaks in the head of a

hollow, and North sixty eight degrees East two hundred and twenty two poles to the beginning. With its Appurtenances To Have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land, With its Appurtenances to the said John Ryburn and his Heirs for ever. In Witness whereof the said Henry Lee Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hands and caused the Great seal of the said Commonwealth to be Affixed at Richmond on the third day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two, and of the Commonwealth the Sixteenth.

a certain tract or parcel of Land containing one thousand
Acres by Survey bearing date the twenty ninth day of September
one thousand seven hundred and ninety, lying and being
in the County of Greecahier on South East Branches of Gauley
River joining their Survey Number seven on the East and
Number ten of twelve hundred and sixty Acres on the West
and bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning at a large Chestnut
on a hill side corner to Number nine of ten, and running
with Number nine North twenty five degrees West two
hundred
