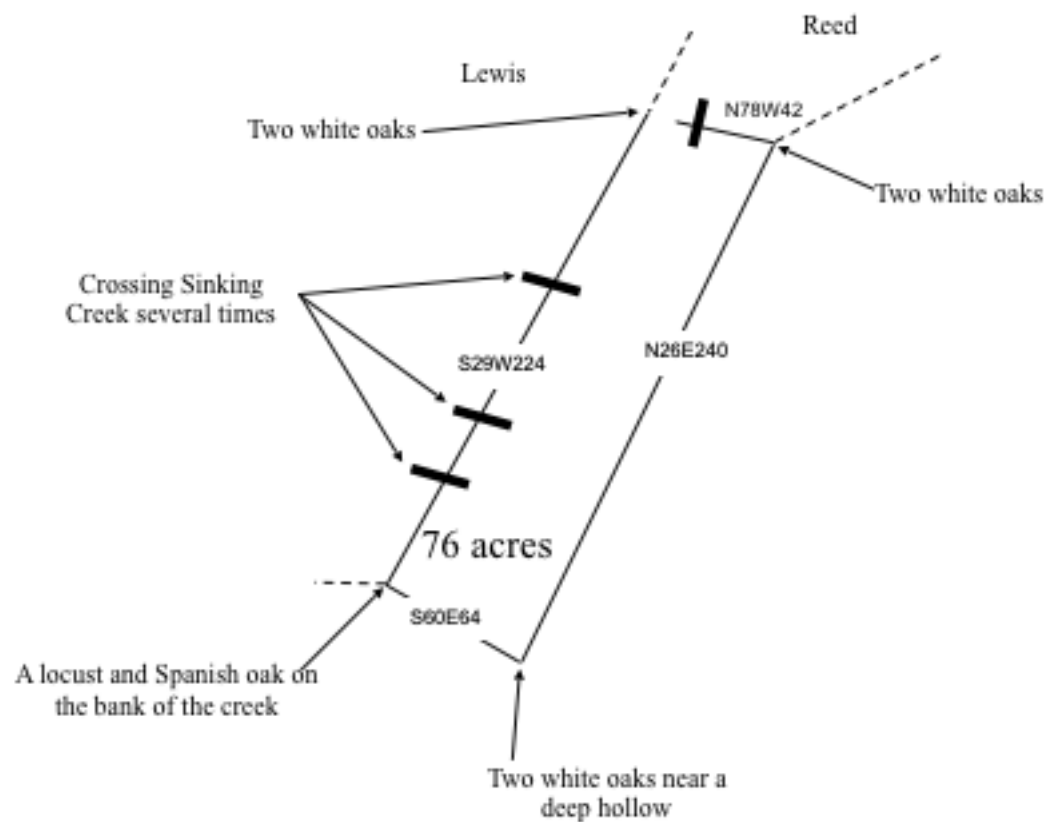
## Description

76 acres in Greenbrier County including part of a survey made for John Finton of 93 acres on Sinking Creek

## Boundary

Beginning at	two white oaks corner to Reed in Lewis' line and with the latter
S29W224	crossing Sinking Creek several times to a locust and Spanish oak on the bank of the creek and on the east side corner to said Lewis and his own land and with the latter
S60E64	to two white oaks near a deep hollow
N26E240	to two white oaks on a line of the old survey corner to Read and with
N78W42	crossing the creek to the beginning

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West fifty Eight poles to a white oak and red oak South  
 twenty degrees West one hundred and Eight poles to a  
 black oak and South Eight degrees West Eight poles  
 to the beginning with its appurtenances To have and  
 to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurte-  
 nances to the said William McCoy and his heirs forever,  
 In Witness whereof the said James Monroe Esquire  
 Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto  
 set his hand and caused the lesser seal of the said  
 Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the  
 twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one  
 Thousand eight hundred and of the Commonwealth  
 the twenty fourth.

 Land office Treasury Warrant Number three hundred  
 and Seventy four issued the thirteenth day of December  
 Seventeen hundred and ninety six There is granted by  
 the said Commonwealth unto Cornelius Vanosdal  
 A certain tract or parcel of land, containing Seventy  
 six acres by Survey bearing date the twenty second  
 day of December one thousand seven hundred and  
 ninety Seven lying and being in the County of Greenbrier  
 Including part of a Survey made for John Hinton

of ninety three acres on Linking Creek and bounded as followeth  
 to wit, beginning at two white oaks corner to Reed in Lewis's  
 line and with the latter South twenty nine degrees West two  
 hundred and twenty four poles crossing Linking <sup>creek</sup> several times  
 to a locust and Spanish oak on the bank of the creek and  
 on the East side corner to said Lewis and his own land and  
 with the latter South sixty degrees East Sixty four poles to  
 two white oaks near a deep hollow North twenty six degrees  
 East two hundred and forty poles to two white oaks on a  
 line of the old Survey corner to Reed and with North twenty  
 Eight degrees West forty two poles crossing the creek to the  
 beginning with its appurtenances To have and to hold the  
 said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said  
 Cornelius Canastota and his heirs for ever, In Witness whereof,  
 the said James Monroe Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth  
 of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser  
 seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond  
 on the twenty first day of January in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand eight hundred and of the Commonwealth the  
 twenty fourth.
