

Description

210 acres in Greenbrier County on the waters of Greenbrier River on the northwest side of Sinking Creek about a mile west from Andrew Lewis' land on the knobs

Boundary

Beginning at	a hickory at the foot of a ridge
N40E140	to a black oak and dogwood on the top of a hill
S50E240	to a white oak
S40W140	to four elms on the bank of Sinking Creek
N50W240	to the beginning

 one pound five shilling sterling paid by William Maud into the
 Treasury of this Commonwealth there is granted by the said
 Commonwealth unto the said William Maud a certain
 tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and ten
 Acres by Survey Bearing Date the twenty ninth
 Day of April one thousand seven hundred and
 fifty one, and being part of an order of Council
 granted to the Greenbrier Company to take up and Survey
 one hundred thousand Acres which order was Established
 and confirmed by a Decree of the Court of appeals made
 in the City of Richmond on the second Day of May
 one thousand seven hundred and eighty three which said
 tract or parcel of land, is lying and being in the County of
 Greenbrier (formerly Augusta) on the waters of Green-
 brier River on the North West side of Sinkings Creek
 about a mile West from Andrew Lewis land on the
 Knobs and Bounded as followeth To wit
 Beginning at a hickory at the foot of a ridge North
 forty Degrees East one hundred and forty poles to a black oak
 and Dogwood on the Top of a hill South fifty Degrees East
 two hundred and forty poles to a white oak South forty
 Degrees West one hundred and forty to four Elm on the

Bank of sinking creek. North fifty Degrees West two hundred and forty poles to the Beginning with its appurtenances to have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said William Ward and his heirs forever In witness whereof the said Edmund Randolph Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the Ninth Day of April in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight and of the Commonwealth the Twelfth
